PIP Successful Applications (Online)

How Many Points?

1. Selma needs to take a lot of different medications. She says that she doesn't need any help taking her medication because she uses a weekly pill organiser so that she can keep track of what she needs to take, and what she has already taken. (**One Activity**)
2. Kamil's disability means that he can't bend down easily. He can manage a shower every day, but he can't reach to wash or dry his own feet. He just sits on the bed for about 15 minutes or so to wait for them to dry naturally. (**Two activities**)
3. Janet's mental health condition fluctuates quite a lot. On some days she is quite good. But on most days she finds she can't be bothered to eat. On those days her Dad phones her at meal times and encourages her to make something. Dad needs to phone back again an hour later to make sure she's actually eaten it, because sometimes she might allow herself to be encouraged to make something, but then lose the motivation to actually eat it. (**Two activities**)
4. George is autistic and non-verbal. His mum believes that he can understand most of what is said to him, and she says she can understand many of his sounds, so that she can meet his care needs. He can't go out on his own at all, he needs supervision all the time (**Two activities**)
5. Gershom is partially sighted. He has to apply special eye drops three times a day. He needs to use a special magnifier to read the labels on food packaging, so that he can use them safely. (**How many activities can you find?**)
6. Kwame has a lot of pain in his hips. He couldn't go as far as 200 metres, but he can walk about 100 metres. He says the pain is such that it takes him a very long time, and means he has to rest for at least an hour after he's done it. (**One activity**)
